Purpose and Goals

- To develop a comprehensive Energy and Climate Change Action Plan that will fully achieve or surpass Executive Order targets for statewide greenhouse gas reductions specified in Executive Order 07-127, including:
 - guidance on the design of a market-based emissions allowance trading program,
 - design of programs to further enable energy conservation
 - closer examination of emissions reduction opportunities offered by new technologies
 - an examination of revenue impacts of emissions reduction policies within the transportation sector
 - consideration of a low-carbon fuel standard
 - further consideration of the organization of Florida's state government to foster the development of a low-carbon energy market in Florida, and
 - other emissions reductions actions

Technical Work Group Roles

- Assist Climate Action Team
 - Identify full range of potential state actions
 - Identify suggested priorities for analysis
 - Suggest straw policy designs
 - Assist with analysis, development and review of options
 - Assist with development of policy alternatives
 - Assist with input to and review of Action Team reports
 - Review and assist with the state GHG inventory and forecast

Stepwise Planning Process

1. Get organized
2. Review and refine inventory & forecast of emissions
3. *Identify a full range of possible actions*
4. *Identify initial priorities for analysis*
5. Develop straw policy design proposals
6. Quantify initial GHG reductions and costs/savings
7. Fully develop policy option templates, including externalities, feasibility issues
8. Develop alternatives to address barriers as needed
9. Aggregate and integrate results
10. Finalize and report recommendations

GP-1	2.1.+ 1.1 + 2.2	11	GHG emissions targets, reporting and accountability measures	Establish goals or targets for statewide GHG emission reductions; review and revise on a periodic basis. Expand GHG to include RE & Energy use reductions; include incentives. Establish and fund mandatory GHG emission reporting, inventory and forecasting functions at state agency; participate in The Climate Registry, provide technical assistance to reporters and encourage participation. Institute an accountability program to measure and report progress in reducing GHG emissions.
GP-2	5.5. + 5.9 + 5.6	7	Public awareness and education	Target Audience: General Public; Increase awareness and engage in climate actions in personal and professional lives. This includes future generations, and community-based organizations, business leaders and visitors; implementation methods to include a Governor's conservation challenge initiative to motivate all Floridians to reduce their energy consumption and take advantage of <i>Volunteer Florida</i> "Serve to Preserve" for residential energy efficiency and renewable outreach.
GP-3	2.13 + 2.19 +3.9 +5.2	6	Inter-government and inter-sector planning coordination and assistance	Establish incentives or mandate programs for local governments to undertake inventories and GHG reduction programs for local government planning, facilities and operations; provide technical support to local governments to enable them to access federal funding for inventories and GHG reductions; work with local governments to establish a standardized methodology for emissions measurement and reporting, and fund software licenses; provide information and education to policy makers at the state and local levels. Coordinate diversified mass transportation planning between local, state and regional agencies for GHG reduction benefits.
GP-4	4.4. + 4.1 + 4.2	6	"Green" business development policies	Create or designate an entity to promote business development opportunities in climate protection including seeking or stimulating funding investments; institute a "business incubator" program to attract and support new business development relating to the new energy economy; state to offer incentive points for competitive state-to-business economic development grant programs for businesses that have undertaken GHG-reduction programs. Promote business and job development in alternative, low carbon fuels and vehicles, and other alternative, low carbon technologies.

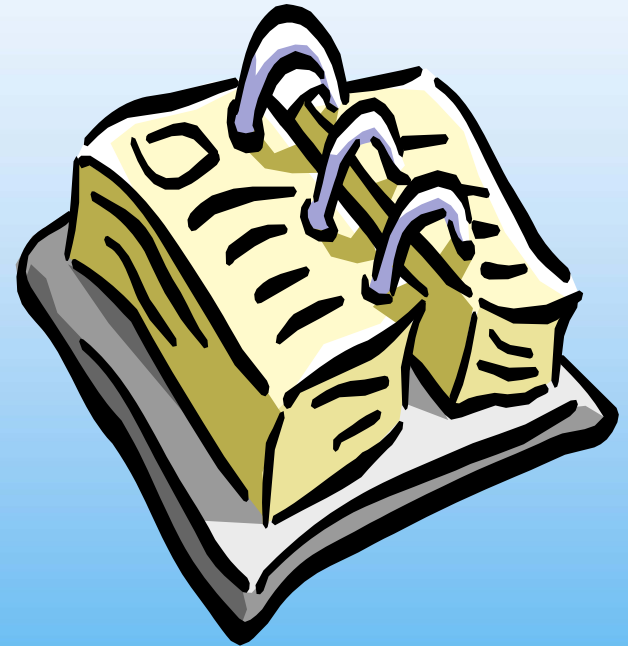
